Upon successful completion of the Powder Horn course participants are awarded a certificate of completion and the Powder Horn Device, which is worn hanging from the left pocket of the uniform.

Course Size

The course will consist of at least 32 participants and not more than 48 participants. **Preference will be given to leaders actively involved in Venturing and Scoutmasters.** Once the course is filled, participants will be given the option of being placed on a waiting list, in case of cancellations. The course deposit will be refunded to those on the waiting list who are not selected after the course has ended.

Course Information

The course will be conducted over two weekends: August 2010 at Camp Scouthaven and September 2010 at Schoellkopf Scout Reserve.

The cost for the course is \$225, which includes all food, program materials, and liability insurance. A deposit of \$75.00 must be submitted with this application and is refundable *ONLY* if there is someone on the waiting list who can participate.

What is Venturing?

Venturing is a youth development program of the Boy Scouts of America for young men and women who are 14 (and have completed the eighth grade) through 20 years of age.

Venturing's purpose is to provide positive experiences to help young people mature and to prepare them to become responsible and caring adults.

Venturing is based on a unique and dynamic relationship between youth, adult leaders, and organizations in their communities. Local community organizations establish a Venturing crew by matching their people and program resources to the interests of young people in the community. The result is a program of exciting and meaningful activities that helps youth pursue their special interests, to grow, to develop leadership skills, and to become good citizens.

Venturing crews can specialize in a variety of avocation or hobby interests.

The Ranger Award exemplifies a challenging high-level outdoor/high-adventure skills advancement program. Once earned, it will identify a Ranger as someone who is skilled at a variety of outdoor sports and interest, trained in outdoor safety, and ready to lead or assist others in activities. Rangers can be great program assets to Cub Scout packs and Boy Scout troops.

Introduction

Powder Horn is an exciting new training opportunity designed to expose the Outdoor Venturing adult leader to activities and resources necessary to operate a successful Venturing Crew. It also familiarizes the advisor with the Ranger program so that he or she can help the Venturer to meet the requirements of the Ranger Award.

Purpose

The Powder Horn Course is designed to help the Venturing leaders, and other adults involved in the unit, to safely conduct outdoor activities of a fun and challenging nature. It provides an introduction to the resources needed to successfully lead Venturers through a program of outdoor adventure.

Course Curriculum

This course is based on the Ranger requirements giving participants an exposure to some outdoor/high adventure activities. All Ranger core requirements will be covered plus a majority of the electives.

Learning Objectives

After completing this course participants should have sufficient introductory information, which will provide the following outcomes:

- 1) Detailed knowledge of the Ranger Award and associated Silver Award requirements.
- 2) Knowledge of the health and safety requirements, and rules and regulations of the Boy Scouts of America as they apply to outdoor programs.
- 3) Introduction to the skills necessary to operate their outdoor program and the certifications necessary and how to obtain those certifications.
- 4) Knowledge of how to identify local resources and consultants for Ranger Award activities.

This course is not a total training program which enables the Venturing or Boy Scout unit leader to be an expert or even self-sufficient in any aspect of outdoor skills. The adult leader will most likely still need knowledgeable, trained, and certified individuals (consultants) to help provide a safe and correct outdoor/high adventure program.

Participant Qualifications

- 1) Must be a registered adult member of the Boy Scouts of America over age 21.
- 2) Must have completed Adult Venturing Leader Basic Training (for Venturing adults) or Scoutmastership Fundamentals (for Boy Scouting adults) prior to attending Powder Horn course.
- 3) Must be able to meet physical requirements of BSA Annual Health and Medical form - physical in a backcountry environment.
